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J B College (Autonomous) : Glorious Past and Promising Future

Jagannath Barooah College, since its inception in the year 1930, has been striving ahead for academic excellence in the field of higher education. As one of the premier institutes of Higher Education in the North East, Jagannath Barooah College added another milestone in its journey of 94 years by being upgraded to the status of Jagannath Barooah University by the Government of Assam by passing the Jagannath Barooah University Act 2023. The College was conferred autonomous status on 13th Oct 2015 and the first batch of students under CBCS (Choice Based Credit System) had been admitted in the 2016-17 session. The college has implemented NEP Course structure and syllabus since 2023 Academic year. The institution has signed MOUs (Memorandum of Understanding) with different organisations to help further the cause of higher education. The organizations are OKD (Omiyo Kumar Das Institute of Social Science), IIE (Indian Institution of Entrepreneurship), Department of Commerce, Dibrugarh University, Kaziranga University, North Eastern Small Scale Industries Association, Jorhat and NIE LIT, Ministry of Communication, ICAR-NBSS & LUP Mahapurush Srimanta Shankardev University etc. The Dept. of Geology is working in collaboration with a number of national and international institutions like George Mason University, USA, Georgia Institute of Technology USA, Red Ford University, USA, University of Kansas, USA & IISc, Bangalore. Proud of its glorious past, confident of its present and hopeful of its future J B College marches on in its search for academic excellence.

Behind the establishment of this premier seat of higher education lies the selfless and enthusiastic commitment of a small but highly learned group of scholars of this culturally rich city who, in fact, shaped the destiny of the academic milieu of the North East region in general and the entire Brahmaputra valley in particular. The valuable contributions made by this dedicated group subsequently led to the formal initiation of an institution known as **Upper Assam College** in Jorhat on 19th August, 1930. Less than a month later, i.e., on 4th September 1930, the first Governing Body (GB) Meeting of the Upper Assam College resolved to name the college as **Jorhat College** and this continued till 1938 when, in a resolution of another GB Meeting, it was again decided to rename the college as **Jagannath Barooah College**. The founder Principal of this oldest institution of the region was Prof. Krishna Kanta Handiqui, world renowned Orientalist, distinguished

scholar and academician. The other dedicated founder teachers were Prof. Tulsi Narayan Sarma (Founder Secretary), Jagneswar Sarma, Phanidhar Dutta, Prafulla Pran Changkakati and Gunagobinda Dutta. Late Murulidhar Barooah donated 15 bighas of prime land in the heart of Jorhat town together with the iconic “Borpatra Kutir”, which houses the administrative offices of the college today. With a small batch of 14 students in 1930, the college began its journey with Intermediate of Arts (IA) which received formal affiliation from Calcutta University in 1931. Thereafter, the progress of the college was rapid. In 1939, the Intermediate of Commerce (I.Com.), in 1941 the Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) in 1944 the Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com), in 1949-50 the Intermediate of Science I.Sc.) and in 1952-53 the Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) streams were opened. From 1931 to 1948, the college was affiliated to Calcutta University and from 1948 to 1965 to Gauhati University. Since the establishment of Dibrugarh University (DU) in 1965, the college has been affiliated to it. The college now has a diversified field of teaching.

Currently it has 20 (+) plus departments, viz., **Assamese, Bengali, Biotechnology, Botany, Chemistry, Commerce, Computer Science, Economics, Electronic Science, English, Film Studies, Geography, Geology, Hindi, History, Mathematics, NCC, Philosophy, Physics, Political Science, Sanskrit, Sociology, Statistics and Zoology.** Since 2013, J.B. College has been imparting Major programmes only. Except **Bengali, Biotechnology, Computer Science, Film Studies and NCC** all other subjects have **Major Courses** at the Degree level. Masters Degree Programme are offered by the Departments of Assamese, Botany, Commerce, English, Geography, History, Mathematics, Physics, Philosophy, Political Science, Computer Science. Ph.D. programmes are being offered by the Depts. of Assamese, Commerce, Physics, Geography and Mathematics. Since its inception, J.B. College has always engaged itself in its search of academic excellence with the motto “**Na, hi Jnanena Sadrisam Pavitramiha Vidyate**” i.e. ‘there is nothing holier than knowledge’.

Certificate courses are offered in the Depts. of Film Studies and Geography. Besides under the Distance Education Scheme of Dibrugarh University, there are PG Courses in Assamese, Commerce, Economics, Mathematics, Political Science and Sociology. There is also a center of K.K. Handique State Open University that offers different UG and PG Courses. Equipped with tools like “College with Potential for Excellence”, Grade ‘A’ and autonomy, the J.B. College fraternity is confident in its mission of providing a conducive environment for the all round development of the community at large and the students in particular.

GENERAL RULES

1. A student shall lose his/her right of Admission to his/her class, if he/she fails to attend his/her classes continuously for 15 teaching days from the date of the commencement of classes.
2. The courses of study in J. B. College are full time courses. No student can take any other full time course concurrently. If any student is admitted to any other course, then the student/guardian should inform the college authority immediately and discontinue the other course if he/she wants to continue the course at J.B. College. Violation of this provision will lead to disciplinary action.
3. **If a newly admitted student of FYUGP & PG First Semester fails to attend classes within 07 (Seven) days from the commencement of classes, he/she will forfeit his/her seat.**
4. Students are responsible for their conduct to the Principal and are prohibited from doing anything either inside or outside the college, that amounts to breach of discipline or interference in the discipline and normal working of the college. Students shall be liable to disciplinary action for violation of any of the rules of discipline. Disciplinary action may involve **warning and/or fine, and/or suspension from classes, from the examination, from the use of the college library or even from the college as such.**
5. Students shall conduct themselves in decorous manner both towards the members of the staff (Teaching and Administrative) and towards their fellow students. Insubordination, unbecoming language or indecorous

- conduct including teasing, ragging, assaulting others, etc. shall be severely dealt with.
5. Students shall maintain perfect silence in the classroom and desist from demonstration or disorderly behaviour. They must not loiter in the corridor or in front of the classroom and must keep as quiet as possible at all times.
7. Students shall take proper care of the college property, furniture and premises and they must not spoil or cause any damage to, or tamper with the college property, furniture and fittings. They shall not litter the college campus.
8. Students shall leave their bicycles, scooters/ motorcycles locked in the shed provided for this purpose. No two-wheelers should be parked in any other part of the college campus.
9. No Society can be formed in the college without the permission of the Principal, nor shall any person be invited to address a meeting in the college without the prior permission of the college authority.
10. Students shall not bring in to college campus any article deemed by the college authority to have a dangerous and /or disruptive influence on the academic environment. Use of Cell phones is strictly prohibited inside the college campus. Students who fail to switch off their Cell phones inside the class will have to pay a fine of Rs.500/- (Rupees five hundred only). Students found in possession of Cell phones inside the examination hall are liable to be expelled.
11. All students will be required to attend classes and other activities held inside the college campus in College **UNIFORM.**

12. Ragging is strictly banned inside the college premises. Students found to be involved in any form of Ragging will be expelled from the college as per the Supreme Court Order. The newly admitted Students will have to submit duly filled Anti-ragging affidavit on the first day of the commencement of class to the Academic Vice Principal of the concerned stream.

Credit fulfillment Criteria

1. **Every student admitted in to J.B. College FYUGP & PG 1st Semester programme must fulfil the required credit. (As per the J.B. College Autonomous Regulations, 2016) Non fulfilment of the required credit will result in debarment of a student from appearing in the end semester examination.**
2. **It is mandatory for a student to appear in the Sessional Examination.**
3. **The college authority will notify the details of the required credit and other related measures in the first week of August, 2024.**

ANTI-RAGGING PROVISIONS

WHAT CONSTITUTES RAGGING:

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- b) Indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.

g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;

h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.

i) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION IN THE EVENT OF RAGGING:

The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed here in under:

- The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
- The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely;

a) Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.

b) Withholding/ withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits.

c) Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process.

d) Withholding results.

e) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.

f) Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel.

g) Cancellation of admission.

h) Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.

i) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.

- Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

- An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie, (i) in case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University, to the Vice-Chancellor of the University; (ii) in case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor. (iii) in case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellor of the institution, as the case may be.
- Where in the opinion of the appointing authority, a lapse is attributable to any member of the faculty or staff of the institution, in the matter of reporting or taking prompt action to prevent an incident of ragging or who display an apathetic or insensitive attitude towards complaints of ragging, or who fail to take timely steps, whether required under these Regulations or otherwise, to prevent an incident or incidents of ragging, then such authority shall initiate departmental disciplinary action, in accordance with the prescribed procedure of the institution, against such member of the faculty or staff. Provided that where such lapse is attributable to the Head of the institution, the authority designated to appoint such Head shall take such departmental disciplinary action; and such action shall be without prejudice to any action that may be taken under the penal laws for abetment of ragging for failure to take timely steps in the prevention of ragging or punishing any student found guilty of ragging.

CLEARANCE RULES :

As per the minutes of second meeting of the Academic Coordination Committee and Examination Coordination Committee held at Old C.M. Block on 8th April, 2024 at 4 p.m. under the Chairmanship of Secretary, Higher Education, Assam in presence of Prof. (Dr.) Nani Gopal Mahanta, the Director of Higher Education, Assam, Dr. Sarat Borkotoki and all Academic Registrars/Dean-Academics of all universities and autonomous colleges of Assam, it was decided to adopt a minimum pass percentage of 40% both the UG and PG with effect from the Academic Session 2024-25. For the students enrolled in the Academic Session 2023-24 the earlier norms, as followed by the HEIs for minimum pass percentage will continue for the entire student life cycle.

ATTENDANCE :

Every student must have minimum 75% attendance in each subject in order to get clearance to sit for the end semester Examination. A student who fails to have minimum 75% attendance and thereby fails to get clearance from every concerned department will be debarred from sitting in the end semester examination.

REGULATIONS FOR THE FOUR YEAR UNDERGRADUATE
ACADEMIC PROGRAMME, 2024
(UNDER NEP, 2020)**

Preamble:

Whereas the Jagannath Barooah College (Autonomous) in exercise of its power conferred by University Grants Commission (UGC) vide its letter no F.22-1/2015 (AC) dated 13 October 2015 is mandated to frame the necessary regulations to conduct different programmes under autonomous status.

whereas to implement the National Education Policy 2020 as mandated by UGC "Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes" the **JAGANNATH BAROOAH COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS) REGULATIONS FOR THE FOUR YEAR UNDERGRADUATE ACADEMIC PROGRAMME, 2023** is enacted and adopted on the 6th Day of May 2023 in the Jagannath Barooah College (Autonomous) 8th Academic Council meeting.

These Regulations shall be effective for the Courses of Study leading to a UG Certificate, UG Diploma, Three Year UG Degree, Four Year UG Degree (Honours) and Four Year UG Degree (Research). A UG certificate after completing 1 year (two semesters), a UG Diploma after completing 2 years (4 semesters), a bachelor's degree (B. Sc./ BA/ B. Com) after 3 years (6 semesters), and a 4-year bachelor's degree (honours) (B. Sc./BA/B. Com) after 8 semesters programme of study.

Short title, commencement, and definition :

These regulations shall be called the **JAGANNATH BAROOAH COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS) FOUR YEARS UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME (FYUGP) REGULATIONS 2023**. The Regulations shall be effective for the Courses of

Study for the degrees of Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) and Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.) programmes, which shall be of four years duration distributed over eight semesters. However, the student has the opportunity of multiple entry and exit after completion of one year (after Second Semester) and two years (after Fourth Semester).

The JAGANNATH BAROOAH COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS) FOUR YEARS UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME (FYUGP) REGULATIONS 2023 shall come into effect from the Academic Session 2023-24.

Definition :

- (i) **College:** The term "College" shall be used to mean Jagannath Barooah College (Autonomous).
- (ii) **Department:** "Department" means a department of the College and designated as such by it, with reference to a subject or group of subjects of study in the College.
- (iii) **Centre:** Centre means Centre of the college conducting certain academic programmes including research in a particular field of study.

**GENERAL PROGRAMME :
FOUR YEAR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME (FYUGP)**

The National Education Policy 2020 is the first education policy of the 21st century and it aims to address the many growing developmental imperatives of our country. The Policy lays particular emphasis on the development of the creative potential of each individual. The course of study according to the NEP, 2020 leads to a UG Certificate, UG Diploma, Three Year UG Degree, Four Year UG Degree (Honours) and Four Year UG Degree (Research). A UG certificate after completing 1 year (two semesters), a UG Diploma after

completing 2 years (4 semesters), a bachelor's degree (B.Sc./BA/B.Com) after 3 years (6 semesters), and a 4-year bachelor's degree (honours) (B.Sc..BA/B.Com) after 8 semesters programme of study.

Undergraduate Programmes: Undergraduate programmes will include the following:

(a) UG Certificate programme: UG Certificate Programme leads to a UG certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study. Students on exit shall be awarded UG certificate (in the Field of Study/Discipline) after securing the requisite 44 Credits and 8 week & 4 Credit summer internship programme on completion of Semester II. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within a period of three years and complete the degree within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

(b) UG Diploma Programme: UG Diploma Programme leads to a UG diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study. Students on exit shall be awarded UG Diploma (in the Field of Study/Discipline) after securing the requisite 88 Credits and 8 week & 4 credit summer internship programme on completion of Semester IV. These students are allowed to re-enter the undergraduate programme within a period of three years and complete the degree within the maximum period of seven years.

(c) Three Year UG Degree Programme (BA/ B.Sc./ B.Com): Students who wish to undergo a 3-year (6 semesters) UG programme shall be awarded a UG degree in the major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 132 credits.

(d) Four Year UG Programme (FYUGP) with honours (BA/ B. Sc./ B. Com): Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded a UG Honours degree in the major discipline after successful

completion of four years, securing a minimum of 176 credits.

Course: The entire programme is divided into a number of courses. A course may be considered as a paper in the conventional education system.

Academic Year: An academic year means a period of twelve months consisting of two Semesters.

Semester: The word "semester" is used to mean a half-yearly programme or term of studies consisting of 15 weeks.

In-semester: The word "in-semester" is used to refer to the continuous studies and evaluations within the semester programme.

End-semester: The word "end-semester" is used to refer to the terminal processes of examinations and evaluations at the end of but within the semester programme.

Semester Classifications:

1st, 3rd, 5th & 7th Semesters- **Odd Semesters**

2nd, 4th, 6th & 8th Semesters- **Even Semesters**

Semester Duration:

- i) **Odd Semesters:** July - December (including end-semester examinations and semester vacation)
- ii) **Even Semester:** January to June (including end-semester examinations and semester vacation)

Credits:

One credit typically represents a certain amount of academic workload for a course. In terms of NEP 2020, one credit is equivalent to 30 notional credit hours of academic work or learning hours which includes attending lectures, participating in discussions, completing assignments, projects, studying and appearing for examination.

A student is eligible to appear in the end-semester examination provided that he/she completes required credits.

Students having a shortage of credit hours have to fill

the deficit by engaging with the teacher(s) concerned and submitting a certificate to this effect before the examination. Failing to comply with this led to the loss of a year on his/her part and as such he/she shall have to apply for readmission in the same semester after one year.

- (v) Value Added Courses (VAC) will be as follows -

8. Evaluation

There will be two stages of evaluation - In-semester evaluation and End-semester evaluation

(i) In-semester evaluation:

- (a) In-semester evaluation shall have 30% weightage.
- (b) other forms of evaluation, which shall be conducted by faculty members teaching the course as per their own schedules, include group discussion/seminar presentation/home assignment (5% weightage)

Aggregated In-semester marks/ grades will be submitted to the Controller of Examinations within a centrally determined date.

The students will be informed in advance about the nature of the assessment. Students shall compulsorily attend in the process of internal assessment, failing which they will not be allowed to appear in the End-semester examination. A Student cannot repeat In-semester examinations. However, if a student fails to appear in any of the In-Semester examinations for reasons considered valid by the department, the department concerned may arrange a special In-semester examination whenever necessary.

(ii) End-semester examination:

- (a) End-semester examination will be conducted centrally at the end of each semester as per the academic calendar shall have 70% weightage.
- (b) The duration of the End-semester theory examination shall be restricted to a maximum of three hours per paper in theory courses.
- (c) The schedule for the end-semester examinations shall be issued by the Controller of the Examinations at least 15 days ahead of the examination.
- (d) The end-semester practical examinations shall be conducted by the concerned course teacher(s) with the help of the Head of the Department.
- (e) The End semester examination shall be normally a written/laboratory-based examination/Project Work/Dissertation
- (f) Setting of question papers, moderation of question papers, evaluation of answer scripts, scrutiny, tabulation of marks, etc. and announcement of results, will be governed by J B College (Autonomous) Examination Rules 2016 framed on the basis of Dibrugarh University Examination Ordinance 1972 (as amended from time to time).

(iii) Practical Examination:

Practical Examinations of a Semester shall be held prior to the End Semester Theory Examinations.

Award of Grade, Grade Point, SGPA and CGPA

- (i) The absolute grading system shall be applied in evaluating the performance of the students.
- (ii) A candidate shall have to secure at least a 'P' grade to pass the course/ programme in both end-semester marks.
- (iii) The marks of in-semester examinations obtained shall be carried over for evaluation in the grade of the course.
- (iv) The following scale of grading system shall be applied to indicate the performance of students in terms of a letter grade and grade points as given below :

Note : Exclusive class interval technique is used here. For example, the class interval 50-60 includes candidates scoring a percentage of marks starting from 50 up to any percentage less than 60.

- 1) The letter grade 'B+' and above shall be considered as First Class.
- 2) A student is considered to have completed a course successfully and earned the prescribed credits if he/she secures a letter grade other than F (Failed) or Ab (Incomplete).
- 3) The pass mark of all Theory and Practical Papers of the End semester examination is 30%.
- 4) The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to two decimal points and reported in the transcripts. **Conversion of CGPA in to percentage (%):** CGPA will be multiplied by 10. Percentage of marks = (CGPA X 10)

- (a) The Letter grade 'B+' and above shall be considered as First Class and Letter grade 'B' shall be considered as Second Class.
- (b) A student is considered to have completed a course successfully and earned the prescribed credits if he/she secures a letter grade other than F (Failed) or 'Abs' (Absent/ Incomplete).
- (c) If a candidate secures 'F' grade in a Course, he/she shall have to reappear in the Course in the next legitimate chance.
- (d) If a student secures 'F' grade in Project Work/ Dissertation/ assignment etc., he/she shall have to re-submit it after necessary revisions. The Result shall be declared with next regular batch.
- (e) 'Abs' grade shall be awarded to a candidate if he/she has not fulfilled the following requirements:
 - (i) If a candidate fails to appear in any Course(s) in an end semester examination.

- (ii) If a candidate fails to submit the project work/dissertation / assignment of an end semester examination.

(iii) If a candidate is certified as not eligible to appear in any course(s) in an end semester examination by the Course Teacher(s) due to insufficient attendance in lectures, tutorials practical or fieldworks.

(vi) The candidates not appearing in a Semester Examination shall be considered as an 'Abs' candidate and that will be reflected in the Grade Sheet of the candidate. These candidate shall have to convert the 'Abs' grade by appearing in the next examination on the Course (provided he/ she has legitimate chance to appear the Course) concerned or by submitting project work/dissertation/assignment etc.

(vii) Results of the candidates appeared in the Betterment or Backlog Examinations shall not be counted for the award of Prizes/Medals, Rank or Distinction.

SGPA :

SGPA will be calculated for each semester on the basis of grades earned by the student in that semester, according to the following mathematical relation.

$$SGPA (S_n) = \frac{\sum(C_i \times G_i)}{\sum C_i},$$

where S_n is the SGPA for the n^{th} semester

C_i is the number of credits of the i^{th} course and

G_i is the grade point scored by the student in the i^{th} course.

CGPA:

CGPA will be calculated for the entire programme on the basis of SGPA earned in all the semesters, according to the following mathematical relation.

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum(C_n \times S_n)}{\sum C_n},$$

Where C_n is the total number of credits in the n^{th} semester and S_n is the SGPA for the n^{th} semester

The following illustrations could be taken as an

example for computing SGPA and CGPA:

Calculation of SGPA from course-wise credit and grade earned by a student for any semester:

SGPA for the Semester will be calculated as-

$$SGPA = \frac{(8 \times 6) + (4 \times 5) + (5 \times 4) + (6 \times 3) + (8 \times 2)}{6 + 5 + 4 + 3 + 2} = \frac{122}{20} = 6.10$$

Calculation of CGPA from the SGPAs earned by a student in eight semesters along with total credit in each semester:

Students will be awarded SGPA/CGPA values considering all the courses. Student(s) failing to earn minimum F-grade in individual paper will be declared as unsuccessful irrespective of SGPA/CGPA value to qualify in each semester.

Results (Pass/Fail):

i) A candidate, will be declared as passed a course, provided he/she secures -

(a) at least 30% marks in the course in the end semester examinations.

(b) at least 30% marks in the course in aggregate in the in- and end-semester examinations.

ii) A candidate will be declared as passed a semester, provided he/she passes all the courses of a semester independently.

iii) The marks of in-semester examinations earned by the candidate will be carried over for declaring any result.

iv) A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of any end-semester examinations up to the eighth Semester will be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as a carry-over course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carryover course in the next regular examinations of those courses. However, the following restrictions will be applicable:

[Note: If a candidate clears the sixth-semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters and eight-semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters then the result of the sixth and eight semester examination of that candidate will be kept withheld and his/her results will be announced only after he/she clears the courses of the previous semesters].

(v) Since the Semester system involves continuous assessment, there will be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.

(vi) A candidate will be declared to have passed the Six-Semester Degree B.A./B.Sc./B.Com programme provided he/she has passed all the Semesters and all the Courses separately

Re-evaluation:

If a student is not satisfied with the marks awarded

to him/her in any end-semester paper, he/she may apply for redressal in standard format within 7 days of publication of the result by surrendering his original mark sheet. The redressal process will proceed through the following stages: **Stage-1.** The evaluated script will be scrutinized, and the result of the re-scrutiny will be provided to the student. If satisfied, the process will be terminated; if not it will proceed to the next stage.

Stage-2. He/ She will be provided with a copy of the evaluated script. If satisfied, the process will be terminated; if not it will proceed to the next stage.

Stage-3. His/ Her script will be re-evaluated, and the result finally declared.

Betterment examination

The student will be given the opportunity of repeating one paper per semester for betterment purposes in the subsequent examination subject to the conditions that (a) the opportunity will be offered for only those courses for 3 or more credits, (b) no betterment opportunity will be allowed for practical papers (c) only one opportunity can be availed per paper opted for the betterment and (d) the opportunity is availed in the very next consecutive examination of the concerned semester.

The candidates will have to apply for a betterment examination within one month of the declaration of the result. In case of betterment attempts, the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained.

Declaration of result:

The CGPA, earned by a student, will be recorded in the marksheet of the final semester. Final semester mark sheets will be generated only for those students who have no backlog in the paper of the previous semesters.

The SGPA earned by the students will be recorded in the mark sheet of each semester. SGPA will be calculated only for those students who have cleared all the courses in that semester.

For those candidates (of any semester) whose mark sheets have been generated, the result will be declared pass/fail. For those candidates whose mark sheet cannot be generated due to non-clearance of earlier semesters (in case of the eighth semester) or any other reason (for any semester), their results will be declared as **withheld**.

Mark-sheet and Grade Card:

A mark sheet will be issued to each student at the end of every semester recording the course-wise marks/grade/grade-point earned by him/her, the result of the student (pass/fail), and the SGPA of the student (in case of passed students). The CGPA of the student will be recorded in each semester mark sheet.

Transcript

The College may issue consolidated Transcript on payment of a prescribed fee which shall contain Letter grades, grade points and SGPA and CGPA mentioning the Course Titles in details, medium of instruction and programme duration.

Academic Bank of Credit:

(i). Institution Registration:

(a) The institution shall register on NAD/ABC in the UGC portal. Institution shall designate a Nodal Officer and set up a dedicated NAD/ABC cell for implementation of NAD/ABC Scheme and reflect their details (Name, Designation, Mobile No. and email id) on its website.

(b) Institution shall advise the students to register on ABC through the ABC portal

(a) Institution shall make ABC id a mandatory field in the admission forms, Examination forms or if possible on students Identity card also.

(b) Institution shall display the posters and templates and place them on the canteen, Library, Notice Board and around the playground or the place where there is maximum movements of students

(c) Institution shall organize Seminar/Workshop for information and publicity about ABC in campus as well as respective affiliated colleges.

Student Registration :

Students shall register themselves by visiting the ABC website and creating a student account through the concerned institution and records have to be submitted to the institution.

Credit Transfer

Inter- Institutional transfer of Credits may be considered by the College on reciprocal basis or in compliance with the relevant Guidelines of the UGC.

Rules for Admission on Transfer from other Institution:

The College shall allow admission on transfer of students from other Higher Educational Institutions.

However, such transfer shall be permissible provided that-

(i) Both the Institutions conduct the same degree programmes under the CBCS.

(ii) The course structure along with the nomenclature of the courses are similar between the two Institutions,

(iii) the combination of courses opted by the candidate are not changed.

(iv) In fulfillment of the conditions as laid down, a candidate may be allowed to get admission on transfer from other Higher Educational Institutions on production of transfer certificate, proof of classes attended, migration certificate, etc. not later than 1 (one) month from the commencement of the classes of the semester concerned. The records of class attendance, performance in internal assessment in his/her credit shall be carried over on admission and shall be computed for the purpose of examination.

With such permission of transfer, the Credits earned by the student shall also be accepted by the University.

A candidate shall have to apply for transfer in the prescribed form to the College

Maximum Duration of an Undergraduate Programme and Maximum Permissible Number of Chances per Course:

A student must clear his/her semester examination within Seven (7) years from the date of admission to the first semester of any programme irrespective of the number of examinations appeared by the student.

CONSEQUENCES OF VIOLATION OF REGULATIONS

All the directives of the regulations shall be strictly followed, failing which Jagannath Barooah College (Autonomous) may take appropriate actions, as it deems fit, against the defaulters.

REMOVAL OF DIFFICULTIES

LIBRARY RULES :

1. All students admitted into J.B. College are members of the college library under the library fees they pay along with the tuition fees.
2. Every student using the college library will be provided a barcode enable library card. It is mandatory to bring a library card along with them while visiting the library and issue books. The library card is not transferable in any form.
3. The borrower is responsible for the book borrowed. Books are issued for 15 days with a provision for renewal of another 15 days.
4. The librarian may recall a book at any time in case of urgency.
5. The loss of the Library card should be immediately reported to the circulation section in writing & duplicate card will be made only after approval by the authorities and necessary payment made.
6. A sum of Rs. 1.00 (one) per book per day will be charged for an overdue book.
7. Final-year students must return their library books before getting admit cards for the final examination & other students must return their library books before the form fill-up.

8. Books once issued will not be allowed to keep inside the library.
9. Carrying bags, personal books, and food items are strictly prohibited & accessories will be kept in the Lockers placed in the library entrance. Mobile phones must be in silent mode before entering the library.
10. Few activities like group discussions and project works are allowed inside the library only after taking permission from the library authority from 2:30 p.m. onwards.
11. Users can issue a duplicate card by paying a nominal fee of Rs. 100 (One hundred only).

LIBRARY SECTIONS

1. **Processing Section:** This section converts purchased books into library resources by processing them according to various library standards such as cataloguing, classification, spine label attachment, cataloguing on Koha ILMS, etc.
2. **Lending Section:** This section is situated on the ground floor of the library where users can borrow books along with them for 14 days. (With the provision of renewal for another 14 days).
3. **Circulation Section:** This section is situated on the ground floor of the library along with the lending section. The KKH library has a very well-equipped circulation desk to provide smooth service to its user. At present, there are two circulation desks for the circulation of books. Services offered by the circulation section are as follows- Membership registration, Issue/Return, Renewal, Issue of Library Clearance certificate, NLIST user registration and password delivery, NDLI registration, alert service, E-mail service, Bibliographic service, etc.
4. **Technical Section:** The main activities of this section are as follows- Maintenance of Koha ILMS, Maintenance

- of the Library portal, Maintenance of Internet resource center, Maintenance of e-resource of the library, etc.
5. **Internet Resource Center:** The internet resource center is located on the ground floor of the library and equipped with 11 numbers of computers and 1 number of the printer. This section is mainly used by the users for accessing e-resources such as e-books, e-journals, databases, etc.
 6. **Manuscript Section:** One of the major achievements of K.K.H. Library is its manuscript section situated on the first floor of the library.
 7. **Periodical Section:** The periodical section is situated on the ground floor of the library and contains printed journals and magazines.
 8. **Back Volume Section:** This section is situated on the ground floor of the library and consists of old bound periodicals.
 9. **Newspaper Section:** The section is situated at the entrance of the library. Here newspapers are placed on specially designed stands for readers.
 10. **Digital Library Section :** The Library procures D Space Digital Library Software.

MEMBERSHIP

The following categories of persons shall become members of the Krishna Kanta Handiqui Library, by default:

- * All the faculty members of college.
- * All the regular students of college.
- * All other regular employees of college.

Provided that a person other than the above categories may be allowed to become member of the library as a special case on a request in writing from the person concerned. The decision of the Librarian in this regard shall be final. If a person is allowed to become a member of the

library he/she shall pay an annual membership fee and security deposit. All eligible members under shall fill up and sign a membership registration form available at the circulation counter of the library.
